Downtown Public Restroom in Constitution Park

Proposal

- Helena Business Improvement District (BID) proposes to purchase, install, and maintain a prefabricated public restroom for downtown Helena.
- The preferred location is Constitution Park.
- The restroom will be open twenty-four hours per day and will be closed only in the coldest of weather.
- The City of Helena, Lewis and Clark County, and the BID have all reserved significant funds for the project.

Need

- Good news! People are gathering on the walking mall, especially on the north end. It is finally functioning as intended. More people = more restroom use.
- Our unsheltered population has increased.
- Downtown businesses are providing restrooms, but their policies are inconsistent. Even if businesses allow restroom use for non-customers, they are closed much of the night.
- Visitors need an easily identified place to go to the restroom.
- Helena does not have a public restroom in the downtown business corridor.



The Product: Portland Loo

Why the Portland Loo?

- Take a look https://portlandloo.com/
- Durable
 - Stainless steel construction, "prison grade" fixtures.
 - o Easy to clean.
 - o Graffiti-resistant coating.
 - o Cold weather package operates to 5 F.



- o Louvers at top and bottom provide visual privacy but allow visual inspection for occupancy.
- o Any potential victims of crime can be heard from the outside.
- o Blue interior lights make finding a vein for intravenous drug use difficult.
- Accessible
 - Fully ADA compliant this is rare in downtown Helena.
 - o Room for a stroller or bicycle.
- Attractive it looks good, right?



Location Considerations

- Proximity to people/need.
- Prominence, observability.
- Grade and access.
- Installation cost.

Best Location: Constitution Park


- Location successfully tested by BID portable restroom since April 2023.
- Near where people gather.
- In the middle of the commercial core.
- Between public restrooms at tennis courts and library.
- Prominent location for visitor visibility and use.
- Observable from 6th and Last Chance.

Why not on the walking mall?

- Installation cost would be greater.
- More isolated from view: more likely for an encampment.

Funding Cost

Ongoing Management Plan

The BID will:

- Buy the Loo.
- Contract for installation.
- Maintain the Loo (repairs).
- Clean or manage cleaning.
- Provide and stock paper and cleaning supplies.

Asking the City of Helena to (not yet confirmed):

- Pay for utilities electricity, water, and sewer.
- Assist with weatherization if necessary.

Conclusion

- Helena needs a downtown public restroom.
- The BID is willing to take the lead on buying, installing, and maintaining it.
- We have most of the funding secured.
- We need approval to apply for TIF funds.
