This email is in response to conditional use permit for emergency shelter use at <u>648 Jackson Street</u> in downtown Helena. I currently own businesses in downtown Helena and have the last few years. As a community member, I have compassion for the growing issue and understand the need for an emergency shelter. As a business owner I strongly disagree with the location proposed in the heart of downtown Helena. When I thought of the idea of opening businesses downtown, I was excited to join what I had hoped to be a vibrant historic downtown, a place where families and tourists felt safe to visit and stay. In the past few months, the growth of the unsheltered population in downtown Helena has made me reconsider whether downtown is a viable location for my businesses. When entering downtown, you are greeted with a "Welcome to Downtown Helena" sign surrounded by encampments of unsheltered individuals, liquor bottles, drug paraphernalia, and debris.

My employees, customers, even delivery drivers are confronted with daily issues with the unsheltered. I have had unsheltered individuals camped out in front of my shops, drunk, leave garbage for me to pick up, and harass customers/visitors as they come and go. Given the information that this will be a "low barrier" shelter that will only be available during <u>4pm-9am</u> is very concerning. I am worried about the overflow into downtown when the shelter is closed (<u>9am-4pm</u>, the main hours for most businesses downtown). I am not only worried about the safety of my patrons and employees, but the negative effect it will have on future growth and potential businesses in downtown Helena. I also feel, given the "low barrier" criteria it will increase unsavory behavior, creating an even more unsafe environment and will likely result in more emergency calls and police response.

Emergency Shelter Proposal

#### Public Comments:

I am expressing my concern over the proposed, permanent 26 bed overnight shelter with the entry on the corner of 13th and Jackson. My wife, Karli, and I own a home at 613 Jackson and have lived there since 2016. We believe that the proposed shelter is going to further erode the appeal of downtown Helena, negatively impact our safety and that of our neighbors as homeowners, and have further negative impact on an at-risk community based on location.

Each year we see more and more public vagrancy, obnoxious intoxicated individuals, and piles of abandoned wares in our neighborhood. The front porch of what was previously Dr. Birkamp's Naturopathic office has become an overnight crash pad. The small grassy space behind Helena Stampworks is a favorite place to smoke or shoot up during the day/sleep at night. Cartwright Park becomes a loitering/littering pad whenever the police move the people along from the concrete pad behind God's Love and the grassy area to its North. Regarding those aforementioned gathering places, they are frankly, an embarrassing deterrent to the businesses that fight to stay alive downtown.

The more downtown shifts from being commerce oriented to services-oriented, the more blighted it becomes, the harder it is to want to come here to shop, eat, and drink. The beautiful art-deco facade of the entrance to the proposed shelter will be negatively affected as you begin to see coffee cans full of cigarette butts and old lawn chairs start to accumulate out front. Look at the entrances to every other service from the Guardian Apartments, to God's Love, to Our Place, to the Mental Health Services building on Jackson. They all look like this. And there's a trail of discarded trash that connects them all.

As our property taxes keep going up, we feel less safe. The majority of folks on our block are older so we worry about our neighbors that live alone. Since we've resided here we've had one murder and at least two break-ins on our block. We both commute on foot to work and walk our dogs all over downtown. This was our primary reason for choosing our location, but it's beginning to feel like it's no longer a safer option. We have a fantastic view of the sunset and The Man Store parking lot. I regularly take time lapse videos of the sunsets and meanwhile observe many of the same people who linger in front of Our Place during the day conducting some awfully seedy business in the parking lot behind CMS and The Man Store, shielded from (most) public view. This has led my wife and I to purchase solar floodlights and "Keep Out" signage for shielded areas on our block.

A walk downtown is rare where we don't get pan-handled or cat called. We've both been personally accosted for no reason while walking home at night. The constant yelling and fighting and police interventions in those gathering places is getting scary. This saddens us because we've loved downtown and are trying hard to build upon its greatness.

This brings me to the choice of location. Talk to any of the friendlier street people and you'll find out that Our Place is already a social hub for those trying to obtain drugs. On the opposite side of the parking lot you have The Man Store and all of its desirables. Then there are all of the shady RVs in-between. This is a powder-keg combination to move an already at-risk population into. As this is all driven by the Dioces, I would like to ask that they consider moving Our Place and this proposed shelter into the building where Good Samaritan (their retail store) exists, and moving Good Samaritan into the building where Our Place and the proposed shelter exist. This would improve the blighted downtown sight with a retail space and move drug and temporary housing services away from an area where commerce should be encouraged.

To whom it may concern,

My name is Karli Mosey, I have been a resident in Helena for 9 years, working in the downtown area for the duration of that time. Our property is 400 feet from the proposed Emergency Shelter at 648 Jackson Street.

To date, I as a citizen have participated in the following with free will:

- Owned property at 613 Jackson Street (Sept 2016), paying property taxes increasing annually
- Managed Ten Mile Creek Brewery, 2015-present, acting as an ambassador to downtown and the Helena area at large
- Founded and presented Community Crate, recirculating more than \$80,000 into the local economy, supporting 150+ businesses/ artists/ organizations (2020-2021)
- Applied for an successfully received TIF \$ for the abatement and demolition of Memorial Apartments (2022), reducing blight in our community
- Personally taken on financial risk to develop a small business with a direct feed to the general tax fund via 4% bed tax (Bell Hotel, projecting tax contributions at \$35,000+ annually)

As conditions and services currently exist, I have witnessed the following behaviors during my daily commute to work, activities and scenarios that have posed a range of discomfort to a direct threat of safety:

- Drug selling, purchasing and use in public
- Urination, defecation and vomiting
- Flagrant littering, and misuse of property and facilities
- Physical, mental and emotional assault

- Trespassing/ breaking and entering in 2+ residences in our neighborhood
- Throwing, or using objects as weapons/threatening displays to entice violence
- Unattended waste, clothing, food, broken glass, medical supplies, etc.
- Loud / inappropriate language and interactions in front of families and youth moving though the area

Within the first 50 feet of my walk to work at 11am/3pm or 4pm I must determine the safest route to enter downtown based on activity between Guardian Apartments/ God's Love and "Triangle Park", and at my walk home from work at 4pm or 10pm, I intentionally take a longer, safer route bypassing downtown- adding .25 miles to my commute, which isn't much/ trip, but cumulatively becomes miles of avoidance of this unsafe area in our community.

Personally, I have invested more than 1,000 hours - sought out and obtained \$175,000 of TIF dollars and fundraised \$250,000 personal dollars in commitment to eliminate blight in Helena, working to clean up and transform the property at 40 E. Lyndale, formerly Memorial Apartments.

What an incredible disappointment to have volunteered more than 2 years of resources, energy, and vision seeking the improvement of a documented blighted property within Downtown Zoning, only to be sabotaged by our own community through the investment and support of a centralized hub of -that will act as an unsightly gateway into a downtown of commerce I am working so hard to promote and stimulate. The gesture trades one blighted location for another with proximity even closer to downtown and residential properties. Choosing this location for the Emergency Shelter insults the efforts I have invested to this point by bringing blight closer to my home and as a physical barrier between my future guests that are being encouraged to patronize downtown.

A thriving, intentional downtown oriented around commerce and culture is not being prioritized with this Emergency Shelter location. Assistive services are of necessity, but the at 648 Jackson Street further challenges the small business owners that give our community identity- presents an unsafe environment for the employees that staff these small businesses- and is a repellent for the potential consumer tasked with navigating through unsafe and unsightly locations.

I ask the City Planning Commission and Zoning Commission to closely evaluate the priority of what long term goals in Helena look like. Dignity for all residents of our area can and should exist, but at a location immediately on our most main street is a visual representation of how this community perceives its best use... Please recognize me as a citizen prioritizing Helena's progress and personally investing in it, with time, resources, and a vision of potential.

NIMBY is a reality in this situation, but everywhere with people is a neighborhood, and all neighborhoods have a purpose for their establishment. This neighborhood is zoned Downtown, the purpose should be commerce and culture.

# In Response to the Request for a Conditional Use Permit to Allow for Emergency Shelter Use in the Helena Downtown District

My Name is Monique Damuth. I reside at 188 Briarwood Ln. Helena, Montana. I have attended one Emergency Housing Task Force Meeting (EHTF) and listened to the November 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> meetings online.

I do NOT support changing the zoning regulations or opening a women's shelter as a Low Barrier Facility adjacent to Our Place which is run by Good Samaritan Ministries.

A Low Barrier Shelter is where no requirements are placed on the guests. Guests are typically allowed to stay while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or substance abuse without having to make any effort towards positive change.

In August 2023, I drove to the downtown Helena Post Office to mail a package and my 90 year old mother was with me. We noticed several homeless men and women sitting in the area between Finstad's and the post office. Their behavior was not good but I figured for a few minutes my Mom would be fine with her window down. Within a minute a very disturbing and disruptive man walked over from God's Love and continued his behavior next to my Mom who appeared very scared.

A year ago, I was leaving Helena Vision when a woman, under the influence of something, was leaving Our Place, she got on a bike with a basket and rode over the curb in front of me and fell off the bike into the Street. I proceeded to assist her in getting up as she grumbled and wobbled away on the bike.

Over the past 20 years in Helena, I have seen a large increase in people living in the parks downtown, even next to God's Love across from the Man Store. We attend Hannaford Street Bible Church and in the last four years, we have had encounters with homeless individuals who behave very poorly when confronted caringly.

I care about our homeless population in Helena. I understand many homeless have mental health or substance abuse issues. They have been hurt deeply and are broken but a meal and place to sleep is not going to heal them.

I walked by the Homeless Camp on OroFino Gulch in September and meet a man living at the camp named "Mr. Cast" He informed me that several of the people were living there because "They don't do well in residential programs". In the November 9<sup>th</sup> EHTF meeting, I listened to Rad speak. He informed the group he had lost his place on the housing list because he had not checked his email and gave a couple excuses. Teresa Ortega, from Good Samaritan, commented she had even helped him clean up his email. In these two situations above, it is those responses that are the consequences which cause their own homelessness.

To help the homeless person with mental health or substance abuse issues heal, feel better about themselves and be part of community they must be responsible and held accountable for their choices.

To live in a community there is governing authority, and we ALL must live by rules and regulations to provide safety and security for everyone. Therefore, it is imperative that individuals take part and be required to a continuum of care from the onset of their arrival (High Barrier). THIS IS THE KIND OF SHELTER I SUPPORT.

What kind of quality of life are we providing for the homeless if we only help keep them alive a few months a year?

There is no simple solution, but I hope Helena can continue to work together to ensure everyone's safety and security.

Public Comment Case # CUP2311-001

I am writing in opposition to the Conditional Use Permit Application for 648 Jackson Street, which is located in my neighborhood. The application outlines a radically bad proposal to address the homeless problem in Helena.

The proposal is openly and shockingly discriminatory, excluding a certain portion of the population based on sex.

If the applicant is successful, it will set the city on the trajectory to disseminate our neighborhood and downtown core. The application imposes almost no minimal standard of conduct for the people it will shelter. The applicant states "the shelter will meet people where they are." It normalizes drug use and will lead to further community decay and increased public safety risk. We need this population to meet us where we are--by working toward sobriety, by producing goods or services through work, and by finding ways to contribute to our community. We need to raise their standard of living, not reduce everyone else's. The naive structure of this model allows and incentivises the people it will service to leave the shelter to use, and in many cases this will mean drug use in the alleys and public areas in our neighborhood, and secondhand cigarette and marijuana smoke drifting from the shelter's smoking patio.

The style of shelter proposed does not reduce homelessness or minimize its negative effects; it increases demand for these types of services and will only draw more transient people here to consume the limited resources our resident needy working poor truly need. Approve a shelter like, and we will find more needles in alleys, more littering, more campers in parks and streets, more wildland, structure, and car fires, fewer carts available when we go grocery shopping, more demand and risk to law enforcement, and more loiterers ignoring crosswalk signals and walking through traffic at malfunction junction. This city does not have the tax base or charitable community to offset the negative externalities this type of shelter would bring.

As a side note, public access to the consideration for this proposal has been absolutely dismal. I have watched the city website closely for information on this issue. The item was on the December 4th Commission meeting, which I made plans to attend. It was then removed from that agenda, moved into a closed administrative meeting, and placed on this December 6th agenda with no reasonable timely notice provided. Not surprisingly, almost all of the public comments now posted to the website are supportive of the application, and it gives the impression that the special interest homeless industry lobby has had greater access to its city government than its permanent residents and taxpayers.
